<p>EUROPEUM has organized a three-part series of events under the umbrella of Climate Assemblies, located in cities of Opava, Třinec and Olomouc. These aimed to encourage exchange of opinions between public, policy makers and stakeholders, defining potential recommendations as well. At the same time, the team proudly presented the big policy analysis publication on topic of housing, and briefings on topics of jobs and housing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Climate Assembly on 15 September 2025.</li> </ul>			

The first Climate Assembly titled “How to Transform Streets into Safe and Welcoming Places? Roundtable on Modern Mobility and Vibrant Cities” took place on 15 September at 4 PM in the Opava Town Hall. The Institute EUROPEUM co-organised the event together with the City of Opava as part of [European Mobility Week](#), in cooperation with the organisation [Walk the City](#).

The roundtable aimed to gather perspectives and impressions from the broader public on modern, sustainable, and accessible urban transport. The discussion focused particularly on sustainable mobility, safety in school surroundings, and tactical interventions in public spaces.

Four invited speakers—Rebeka Hengalová (Institute EUROPEUM), Josef Laža (MAPPA), Václav Urban (City of Jeseník), and Blanka Klimešová (Walk the City)—presented examples of good practice and shared insights on how cities can introduce modern mobility solutions. They discussed current projects in tactical urbanism and explored how streets can be redesigned to become more pleasant, safe, and people-friendly.

- Climate Assembly on 30 October 2025.

The second Climate Assembly took place on 30 October at 3 PM in Třinec. It focused on the future of the labour market in the Moravian-Silesian Region and the growing need for reskilling. Institute EUROPEUM organised the debate in cooperation with the [Moravian-Silesian Employment Pact](#).

Participants discussed how economic transition, decarbonisation and technological change are already affecting employment in the region. They emphasised the need for a more transformative education system and greater support for technical professions. Invited attendees stressed that young people must be encouraged to enter technical fields, while companies require more precise long-term planning and better communication around climate and industrial policies.

Mr Martin Navrátil, Director of the Moravian-Silesian Employment Pact, presented the Pact's current initiatives and activities, including efforts to identify key qualities and to support digitalisation and targeted retraining.

- Climate Assembly on 6th November 2025.

The Third Climate Assembly took place in Olomouc as part of a trade fair – [Modern house](#) on the 6th of November from 16:00. A Researcher from the Institute EUROPEUM, Rebeka Hengalová, presented data from a questionnaire survey on how successful Czech households are in obtaining subsidies from the New Green Savings (NGS) program.

Ms Hengalová explained the barriers and motivations of Czech citizens for applying for the NGS, their satisfaction with the results, and their awareness of subsidies available in the Czech Republic. Participants engaged in discussion and shared their experiences of climate-friendly renovation, the challenges they faced before or during renovation, and their knowledge of subsidies in the Czech Republic.
